Chamber says Super School is not the right fit for the community.

Monday, June 12, 2017 - Tonight, at West Ferris Intermediate Secondary School, the Near North District School will be holding its final special Board meeting regarding the future of three secondary schools in our City. The ARC process has been ongoing for the past number of months with numerous public meetings and presentations from the public which culminated in a recommendation from the committee to eliminate one of the schools and refurbish/expand the remaining two.

The ARC Committee asked for and listened to the public input. After the consultation, they completed their assigned task, which of course was the recommendation noted above. Further to their recommendation, a staff recommendation and report regarding the process was produced on May 23, 2017. The staff recommendation regarding the secondary schools also agrees with the ARC committee recommendation and provides further recommendations to: 1) determine the appropriate north site (Chippewa or Widdifield), 2) determine appropriate site for Special Education Programs, and 3) refurbishment of the two 7-12 sites rather than new build.

The business community is fully aware that the Board is faced with some tough decisions. Financially, 3:1 is the most viable long-term solution. But this issue is more than a financial decision. This is about community, where we live and where our children learn and play. High school rivalries have been around since the


second school opened in our city many decades before this writer was born. After 40+ years of being out of high school, friendly rivalries continue to exist amongst former high school friends from "the other schools". This has been a part of our lives, our children's lives and I certainly hope, our grand children's lives.

The North Bay and District Chamber of Commerce Board and members have expressed concern, made presentations, talked to trustee's and made their views

known. Closing existing secondary schools and consolidating to one Super School will have a direct impact on our community and not just the business community. The Board Trustee's have the opportunity to show that democracy works and that it isn't just about the number's. Listen to your community, listen to the experts, the Super School is not an option for this community.

KNOW THE SIGNS MAKE THE CALL

Human trafficking is an offence that involves controlling, forcing, intimidating or deceiving a person of any age in order to exploit them through various forms of sexual exploitation or forced labour.

This crime can happen in communities of all sizes, and in all kinds of properties from budget motels to luxury hotels and resorts. Human trafficking/sexual exploitation isn't always easy to spot, but there are some signs you can watch for.

SEXUAL EXPLOITATION IS ABUSE

SIGNS THAT SOMEONE MAY BE A VICTIM:

- They may seem disoriented or disheveled.
 - They appear withdrawn and/or intimidated (rarely smile).
 - They rarely, if ever, leave the premises or are escorted whenever they do.
 - The person/people they're with seems to be preventing them from moving about freely.
 - They may be made up to look older than they really are.
 - They may show signs of physical abuse.
 - They're rarely left alone.
 - The person/people they're with are significantly older.
 - They don't have their own credit cards or forms of identification.
 - They may have tattoos that mark ownership.
 - International victims might have a very limited knowledge of English (if any) and will often travel with others, but one person will obviously be in charge of the group.
- Other signs:
- A lot of male visitors to one room.
 - Guest rooms with lots of condoms or condom wrappers, lubricants, lingerie, sex toys, drugs or drug paraphernalia.
 - High traffic to guest rooms.
 - Guests who don't want their rooms cleaned.
 - A person who refuses to leave a credit card imprint and insists on paying cash, or uses disposable or reloadable gift credit cards.

A Message from the Ontario Chamber of Commerce - Keep Ontario Working



The Changing Workplaces Review and resulting *Fair Workplaces, Better Jobs Act* has presented new and concerning challenges for our members and Ontario's business community broadly.

The Keep Ontario Working (KOW) group, a coalition of Ontario's leading industry and sector associations as well as major employers, met on Monday at the OCC office to discuss the next steps in our advocacy campaign. KOW is an impressive example of the OCC leading public policy change and bringing together divergent voices to strengthen our collective advocacy. Broadly, our goal will be to confront elements of the legislation that we think there is still room for negotiation on, while bringing evidence to the table to support the notion of a broader package of offsets to help the business community transition into these new changes.

We wanted to provide you with details on these next steps and how you can support these efforts. The KOW website has been updated with new content and calls to action. You can visit it at www.KeepOntarioWorking.com. The next phase of our letter writing campaign has launched. The Coalition intends to conduct its own economic impact analysis on these changes over the course of the summer, to then be followed by a broader report that identifies the real and specific challenges that will arise in communities across this province as a result of these legislative changes.
